Now let's go back to the origin of the imperial mode of living. What do you know about how colonialism has been perpetrated? In museums there are frequently objects and even human remains (e.g. mummified bodies or skulls) which have just been taken away without any permission. That is: stolen!

If you have the chance, go to a museum or visit a museum online. Observe the objects they have there.

Choose together one which originates from far away. What is its story? Where is it from, who used it, who found it... and what is the story behind how it ended up where you can see it?

Visualise its story with a timeline and mark what information is real and which is your assumption!

Important: Be sensitive: ask people who you are close with, let them tell you what they want, don't pressure for details and don't question their stories.
