# Create content for whiteboard and cut-out animation

In this final tutorial, you'll find some tips on how to create your content for whiteboard and cut-out animation. Let's get started:

### **Drawing**

To improve your drawing skills, focus on simple pictograms, see? Also, practice drawing objects using geometrical figures. Psst, a little tip: If you can draw a triangle, a square, a rectangle, and a circle, you can draw anything! For example, a car: three rectangles, two circles! Done!

### **Script**

Write down what you plan on saying, without getting too wordy. Keep your message simple! That's easier for your audience to follow.

# Storyboard

Here you decide your frame-to-frame movements. Remember, your drawings should reinforce your script. No confusions here!

### Animate the storyboard

Match your storyboard with your script. If you can, record your buddy while drawing.















### Time the animation

That means tying your animation back to your script, so your image has the time your text needs. You can take each frame and change your script as much as you want while tweaking the timing.



#### Perform your project live

It's show time! Present your work in front of an audience. Perform your script live while showing your drawings. Using a flip chart with all your visuals could be ideal for this.

Performing can be intimidating. Prepare by taking a couple of deep breaths before starting. You can do this!



## **Record your presentation**

You can also record your presentation. Or just your visuals. In this case, record a voice over! You need your script and a recording device, like a smartphone. Rehearse before recording! Highlight important words in the script, it will keep your voice interesting as you read. Record at least 2 different versions, so you and your buddy have options.
