

# Foster peer-learning!

## Sharing is caring!

Now that you know the tools for good team collaboration, you can support OTHERS in their learning process! Sharing is caring! Don't worry, it will be fun!

And with the right content, you can encourage your audience to work in buddy teams!

How? Let's take a look at it through an example activity about the water cycle:

As a warm-up:

### Let them share knowledge

Ask your audience to share what they know about water, like: where does it come from? What do we use it for? What are the different forms of water? And so on. Everybody knows something about water, so everyone can feel included and can contribute. Then you can show a cool video you made or one you found about the water cycle.

### Discuss

After they have watched the video, give them some cool activities. Ask them to complete the worksheet at the bottom of the screen or page and discuss the core issues of the topic. This is a good way to check if they understood it correctly and find out what they might have missed.





## Research and share

Now help them expand their knowledge of the topic. Following our example, we could ask them to research solar radiation and humidity. Encourage them to share their findings at the end!

## Create

Using all the knowledge they have gained by completing the tasks you gave them, they can now CREATE, for example, a presentation on how the water cycle works, or, for advanced teams, a plan for how to use rainwater in their own households.

## Feedback

At the end, you could help them reflect on how they have been doing as a team so that they can really learn from this experience. Ask them questions like:

What did you like most? What was the most important thing you learnt from this activity?

How was it to work together in a team? What would you do differently?

By sharing their answers with their buddies, they can give feedback, evaluate their learning process, and improve on it for next time!

Let's recap the five easy steps to make your audience work together:

share knowledge, discuss, research and share again, create content and give feedback.

And now off you go! Start planning your own content!
